HB 4208 Sub 3	(Spade) Redefines qualifications for deaf and deaf-blind interpreters. (Same as SB 25.)
HB 4220	(Espinoza) Allow board members to volunteer services.
HB 4273	(Melton) Funding for students in strict discipline academies located in juvenile detention facilities is not the responsibility of the SAF unless the facility is operated by DHS.
HB 4375 & 4376	(Condino) Fixes commercial rental property tax loophole.
HB 4500	(Cushingberry) Raises state income tax from 3.9 to 4.6% through 2012.
HB 4506 & 4507	(Ward) All school board elections must be held in November.
HB 4533	(Meisner) Allows teachers to bargain for privatization ban. Same as SB424.
HB 4588	(Tobocman) Allows local governments to purchase from MiDEAL.
HB 4592 Sub 2	(Melton) Requires LEAs to develop a consolidation of services plan that is then submitted to the ISD, then forwarded to MDE.
HB 4761	(Jackson) Requires teacher/administrator suspecting pupil violence to talk with parents.
HB 4779	(Jackson) Reinstates administrator certification
HB 4790	(Gonzales) Requires physical education at least once a week for all grades.
HB 4796 Tie barred to HB 4500	(Ward) Caps any administrator's salary to that of the Governor
HB 4799	(Wenke) Retirees returning to schools as contracted employees will have their retirement suspended.
HB 4801	(Ward) Removes income tax deduction for retirees.
HB 4803	(Wenke) Limits benefits to school employees.

QUICK GUIDE TO EDUCATIONAL LEGISLATION UNDER DEBATE – 2007

SENATE

Bill No.	Description and Sponsor
SB 54	(Whitmer) Expand use of sinking funds to include some items previously viewed as operating expenses.
SB 70	(Cassis) Postpone for one year the requirement that all teachers must take a three credit hour course on reading remediation.
SB 107	(Anderson) Requires anti-bullying policy (same as HB 4162)
SB 188	(Van Woerkom) Changes definition of vocational education.
SB 194	(Switalski) Same as HB 4273. Allows DHS to operate strict discipline academies.
SB 367	(Kuipers) Change the term “sinking fund” to “infrastructure investment funds.”
SB 386	(Patterson) CRCs will be required for school volunteers, all employees and contractual service providers.
SB 403 (S-1)	(Kuipers) Allows changes in high school graduation requirements for transfer students.
SB 413	(Patterson) Requires state superintendent and SBE to define “adequate funding” for schools and submit a report to the legislature.
SB 414	(Kahn) Changes requirement for disbursing school aid when falls on a weekend to the <u>next</u> business day, rather than the <u>previous</u> business day
SB 415-416 S-1	(Cherry) Schools are encouraged to provide information regarding the HPV vaccine.
SB 418-419 SB 420-421	(Jansen) Allows for the creation of a state-wide catastrophic claims pool for all government employees.
SB 424	(Prusi) Will allow unions to bargain privatization for non-instructional positions.
SB 474-475	(Cassis) Move Kindergarten start date from Dec. 1 to Sept. 1.
SB 482	(Gleason) Include MEAP social studies test as qualifier for Michigan Merit.
SB 500	(Thomas) Raises to \$19,653 the amount for competitive bidding of contracts.
SB 508	(Same as HB 4790) Requires minimum amounts of PE in school.
